League Play:

A quick reminder to make sure your attested scores match what was logged in Golf Genius.

Rules/Handicaps:

In future newsletters, Deb Lawson, our Rules/Handicap Chair, will be providing a Rule of the Month. This month, she has a few to cover:

 <u>Relief from landscaped areas:</u> Relief is *one club length* from the nearest point of *complete* relief. Take your initial stance <u>one club length</u> from the ball in the landscaped area. If you are still in a free relief area (ie the cart path), take another stance <u>one club length</u> from there. By now, you are likely to be in a playable area, even if you are in the desert. NOTE: You may not go back several feet or yards along the line of your shot for relief, unless it is one club length from the ball, as you could do if you are taking penalty relief.

- 2. <u>Damaged hole on green</u>: Damage to the hole is covered by <u>Rule 13.1c</u> as part of damage on a putting green. The player may repair a damaged hole unless the damage is natural wear, which is not allowed to be repaired. For example, if the hole is damaged in removing the flagstick, it may be repaired by the player, even if the damage has changed the dimensions of the hole. This rule is important to remember, because most of us have been under the impression that damage on the lip of the hole is not repairable.
- 3. <u>Posting nine holes:</u> You must play all 18 holes *or* 1-9 *or* 10-18 to post a round. There is no course rating and slope rating for nine holes that overlap the front and back nine. GHIN will not let you post in that situation. You must complete the front nine or the back nine of a course before you can post your score. Also, we no longer post holes that we do not play as "net par". Post your complete front nine or back nine, and GHIN will calculate the unplayed or blank holes.

General League Stuff:

Thank you to Patti Jo Lewis, who has taken over the job of populating our bulletin board. Stop in the hallway the next time you are at the Pro Shop and check it out. It looks great!

The Board has made a few minor updates to our Policies and Procedures, and it is now posted on our website. You can print a copy from the website if you like to maintain a paper version of the P&Ps.

VP Nanci Messner consolidated our first survey results following the lunch at the President's Cup and we provided the results to the Robson Events Management team. I've attached the consolidated results to this newsletter, if you are interested.
