February weather interfered with our Day 1 Del Sud, and also made us realize we need a dynamic notification system when play is canceled at the last minute, or during a round. Fortunately, it turns out our Premium Golf Genius software supports the ability to do that. League Chair Cathy Steel and Assistant Pro Ken Steinke have put together a notification process using Golf Genius text messaging functionality. Cathy already communicated the process to the Day 2 Del Sud players.

In addition, our Board will be establishing protocols for cancellation of play during bad weather. Those of us from the Midwest know to get off the course immediately if there is thunder and/or lightning. Lightning can strike even if it's not raining. Golfers are particularly vulnerable to lightning strikes, and standing under a tree is one of the worst things you can do. Since our course does not have a "get off the course" horn, we will establish another method of telling our golfers when it's time to stop everything and exit the course.

We'll be sending a communication to all League members once both of the above processes are fully defined.

Are slicing or hooking off the tee? Does your ball end up in the rough or OB? Did it catch that bunker on #1 or the hill on #11 and now you have a bad 2nd shot or a difficult drop? Put away your driver! According to Pro Caddie Brian Vranesh, hitting a fairway wood off the tee will keep the ball in play more often. A 3-wood or 5-wood can have more

loft and is easier to control. Try it! You also might be surprised that your fairway wood gets nearly as much distance as your driver, and more importantly, your ball will be findable.
