

Summer 2019 President's Message

Hi Ladies-

Summer is flying by, and I'm way behind on a lot of things, including my "monthly" President's letter.

First off, since you probably won't read all the way to the end of this email, I want to let you know that we will be having an all-member meeting on September 17 after golf. Even if you're not playing that day, please plan to attend the meeting.

By now you probably have heard that the dates for overseeding the course have been pushed back a couple of weeks. The Course will now be closed from October 7 through October 28, with cart-path only play from Oct. 29 through Nov. 11.

The overseeding change caused us to modify the dates of our Solheim Cup. It will now be held on November 5 and November 12. With this change, only one of the days will be cart-path only (hopefully). If you haven't played in the Solheim Cup in the past, it's a fun team event where the two teams square off in 2-on-2 match play formats. If you're interested in being a Captain for this event, let me know.

Speaking of fun team events, at the Mixed Stix tournament we had 64 men and women play and the Big Dog red team squeaked out a 1 point victory (144.5 to 143.5) over the Blue Haboob team. Thanks to Charlotte Graham and Gaye Ohanian for being captains.

And we had another of our big tournaments earlier this summer--the Del Sud tournament. Diane Taylor had a career round the second day and won the 2-day eclectic tournament by 6 strokes. In this event, your one best score on each hole over the two days is your tournament score. Diane had a net score of 58, which included 5 net eagles.

The Del Sud is one of our two Southern District tournaments that we have each year. The second one--the Telegraph Tournament--is on August 27. It's a one-day low net tournament, and we're planning some cool treats for afterwards.

Our Sadie Hawkins event is on September 10. Ladies get to invite a non-related man to play with them in a better-ball tournament. Watch for more details coming soon.

The 2nd annual Community Golf Event will be September 15. This is a fun 9 holes of golf and lunch, sponsored by Robson, that brings golfers and non-golfers together on the course. Watch for a Ranch-wide email about the signups for the event. All the money from your entry fees and the raffles will go to two local charities--Saddlebrooke Community Outreach and Tucson's First Tee Program.

In October we will participate in "Ranch Rallies for a Cure" to raise awareness about all forms of cancer. You'll see various clubs doing different activities throughout the month. We will have a scramble tournament/fundraiser on our first day back--October 29.
